The Commission on Ethnic Diversity was established in 1989 by President Eugene Hughes. Members join on a voluntary basis.

- An executive board with two co-chairs and 14 elected members manages the commission in partnership with the Office of the President.
- Members include more than 50 students, faculty, staff, and administrators who serve in an advisory capacity.
- Standing committees work on key campus issues such as recruitment and retention, diversity awards, membership and marketing, and leadership and diversity.
- Membership meetings are held three times per term.
